

WELCOME TO FARM AND FOREST

Morningside's Farm and Forest Festival was originally designed to introduce visitors to Morningside Nature Center. The "Farm" part of the name references the human ecology programs developed for use at the 1870's Living History Farm. The "Forest" portion refers to Morningside's natural history features, including trails, boardwalk, wetlands, and activities such as birding, plant study, and formal science programs. The Festival has become a re-enactment of rural life in North Florida during the third quarter of the 19th century. These earlier Floridians had a tie to the land, both the fields they tilled and the forest surrounding them, which we wish to revisit. With our Festival we celebrate and honor the important cultural and historical contributions that these early Florida settlers made to our state.




